

Varsity Boys Fight Past Bulldogs, 54-42

The varsity boys basketball managed to escape with a 12-point victory last Tuesday night against Dixon.

Those who were at the game weren't sure whether the boys were playing basketball or football or competing in a boxing match. A total of 44 free throws was shot in the contest.

Vienna took an early 17-10 lead after the first quarter but the Bulldogs fought back to bring the score within four points at halftime, 28-24. Dixon

took the lead in the second half but not for long as the Eagles fought back to defeat the Bulldogs 54-42.


Chris Helton led the Eagles with 15 points, 7 rebounds and 1 assist. Neil Copeland followed with 13 points (two 3-pointers), 4 rebounds, 5 assists and 4 steals; Jarret Struempf, 8 points, 6 rebounds; Shaun Potter, 7 points (two 3-pointers), 1 rebound; Jeff

Stricklan, 7 points, 7 rebounds, 2 assists; Jason Roberson, 3 points (one 3-pointer), 2 rebounds, 1 assist, 1 steal; and Chad Russell, 1 point, 1 rebound and 1 steal.

Vienna shot 13-30 from the free throw line for 43%. Dixon shot 10-14 from the free throw line for 71%.

Jimmy Foster led the Bulldogs with 14 points.

The varsity boys are now 18-2 overall.



JV Boys Fall To Dixon, 42-56

The junior varsity boys basketball team hosted the Dixon Bulldogs Tuesday, Feb. 18.

Dixon took an early 6-12 lead at the end of the first quarter and extended their lead even larger in the second quarter. But three consecutive 3-pointers by the Eagles brought them within 10 at halftime, 21-31.

The Eagles came out hot in the third quarter, popping more 3-pointers but still trailed 36-41 going into the final quarter.


Dixon exploded for 15 points in the final quarter to come away with a 56-42 victory over the Eagles.
