

Varsity Boys Capture 20th Win Of The Season

The varsity boys basketball team traveled to rival Fatima Comets Saturday, Feb. 22 for a make up game.

The Eagles led 7-5 after the first quarter and held the Comets to only two points in the second quarter to take a 19-7 lead at halftime. The Eagles kept their lead at 25-18 at the end of the third quarter and went on to defeat the Comets 41-30.

Neil Copeland led the Eagles with 17 points, 5-7 FT, 4 rebounds and 4 assists; Chris Helton, 10 points, 8 rebounds; Jarret Struempfler, 8 points, 4-9 FT, 6 rebounds, 1 steal, 2 assists; Jason Roberson, 5 points (one 3-pointer), 1 rebound, 1 steal, 1 assist; John Schwartze, 1 point, 1-4 FT, 3 rebounds, 2 steals, 1

assist; Shaun Potter, 2 rebounds; Chad Russell, 2 rebounds; and Jeff Stricklan, 4 rebounds and 1 assist.

The Eagles had a good defensive game holding Fatima's lead scorer, Matt Roberson, to only seven points. Roberson also ended up fouling out with 1:30 left in the fourth quarter.

Vienna committed seven turnovers in the game and committed 10 team fouls while Fatima committed 19.

Vienna shot 1-6 from the 3-point line for 17% and 14-31 from the field for 45%. Fatima shot 3-19 from the 3-point line for 16% and 9-28 from the field for 32%.

The varsity boys are now 20-2 overall and 8-0 in the GVC.
