Varsity Boys Come From Behind To Defeat Fatima

The VHS varsity boys basketball team came from behind to defeat rival Fatima Saturday night, Jan. 8.

The Eagles were all tied up 8-8 after the first quarter and fell behind 17-22 at the half. Vienna outscored the Comets 35-27 in the second half to pull off the 52-49 win, the Eagles fourth in a row.

Tony James had an outstanding second half as he poured in 13 of his 15 points. James also had 4 rebounds, 2 steals, 4 assists and 1 blocked shot.

Others contributing to the scoring included Mitch Wieberg, 9 points, 6 rebounds; Sam

Barnhart, 8 points, 3 rebounds, 1 assist; Chad James, 7 points, 2 rebounds, 1 steal, 2 blocked shots; Nathan Copeland, 4 points, 1 rebound, 1 steal; Tyler Schwartze, 4 points, 3 rebounds, 1 steal, 3 assists; Kenneth Roberson, 3 points, 4 assists; and Korbey Canuto, 2 points, 1 rebound, 1 assist.

Fatima was led by Sean Haslag 19, Mitch Bonnet 13, and Tim Heckman 10.

The varsity boys are now 7-4 overall (0-1 in the conference). They will play at Steelville Friday, Jan. 14.

The junior varsity Eagles were trailing by only one point

heading into the final quarter, 23-24. However, the Comets shutout the Eagles in the fourth quarter and scored nine points of their own to go on to a 35-23 victory.

Justin Helton led the Eagles with 8 points. Abe Rowden, Sam Hagan and B.J. Asberry each added four points and Tommy Haller had 3 points.

The Eagles shot only two free throws the entire game while the Comets shot 16.

Fatima was led by T. Brune with 10 points.
