

# Varsity Girls Take Third In Stoutland Tournament

The Vienna High School varsity girls basketball team took third place in the Stoutland Round Robin Tournament last week. Four teams participated in the tournament: Stoutland, Vienna, Conway and Hurley.

## Vienna 69, Hurley 44

In first round action, the Eagles faced Hurley and jumped out to a huge 47-19 lead at halftime and went on to a 69-44 win.

Amy Hollis led the Eagles with 23 points (three 3-pointers), 5 rebounds, 8 steals, 4 assists; Kelly Steinman, 11 points (one 3-pointer), 6 rebounds, 2 steals, 1 assist; Amanda Juergens, 10 points, 8 rebounds, 4 steals, 2 assists; Jenny Fick, 8 points (two 3-pointers), 2 rebounds, 4 steals, 2 assists; Monica Slone, 8 points, 1 rebound, 1 steal, 1 assist, 1 blocked shot; Erin Henderson, 6 points, 2 rebounds, 1 steal, 2 assists; Debra Lee Snodgrass, 2 points, 2 rebounds, 1 steal; and Laurie Snodgrass, 1 point, 5 rebounds, 2 steals, 2 assists.

Vienna shot 28/76 from the field (37%) and 7/8 from the free throw line (88%).

"We shot the ball real well, both from the field and from the free throw line," said head coach Mick Byrd. "Our guards did a nice job rebounding. Hurley has a very young team and played hard."

## Vienna 48, Conway 64

In second round action, Vienna faced Conway. The Eagles trailed by only three points at halftime, however Conway came out strong in the second half, outscoring Vienna 33-20 to take a 64-48 win.

Amy Hollis led the Eagles with 18 points (three 3-pointers), 5 rebounds, 1 steal, 4 assists; Kelly Steinman, 8 points (two 3-pointers), 4 rebounds, 3 steals, 2 assists; Monica Slone, 6 points, 7 rebounds; Laurie Snodgrass, 6 points (one 3-pointer), 2

rebounds, 3 steals; Erin Henderson, 4 points, 4 rebounds; Jenny Fick, 3 points (one 3-pointer), 1 rebound; Amanda Juergens, 3 points (one 3-pointer), 3 rebounds; and Debra Lee Snodgrass, 2 rebounds, 1 assist.

Vienna shot 17/61 from the field (27%) and 7/10 from the free throw line (70%).

"They shot 25 free throws. We shot 10," said Byrd. "They blocked about 100 shots, it seemed. We didn't catch many breaks from any officiating standpoint, but we also didn't play very good defense by our standards. We just got killed on the boards."

## Vienna 48, Stoutland 59

In third round action, Vienna fell to Stoutland 48-59 after being down 20-27 at the half.

Monica Slone led the Eagles with 13 points, 10 rebounds, 1 assist; Amy Hollis, 11 points, 4 rebounds, 2 steals, 6 assists; Laurie Snodgrass, 10 points, 2 rebounds, 1 steal; Amanda Juergens, 5 points (one 3-pointer), 5 rebounds, 1 assist; Kelly Steinman, 4 points, 4 rebounds, 3 steals, 2 assists; Jenny Fick; 3 points (one 3-pointer), 1 rebound, 2 steals, 2 assists; Erin Henderson, 2 points, 2 rebounds, 1 assist; and Debra Lee Snodgrass, 3 rebounds.

Vienna shot 15/56 from the field (28%).

"I was proud of the way we competed and played together Saturday night," said Byrd. "It was a real good team effort. Amanda Juergens hit a 3-pointer early in the fourth quarter to tie the score after we had spent the whole game fighting from behind. From that point on Stoutland shot 23 free throws. That's pretty hard to overcome. We played hard in the tournament."

The varsity girls are now 10-4 overall (3-0 in the conference).
