

Vienna Falls To Viburnum

The Vienna High School varsity girls basketball team fell to the Viburnum Bluejays last Thursday, Jan. 27 in Gasconade Valley Conference action.

The Eagles trailed 10-14 at the end of the first quarter and

19-28 at halftime. The Bluejays outscored the Eagles 35-32 in the second half to go on to a 51-63 win.

Vienna shot 18/64 from the field (28%) and 12/24 from the free throw line (50%). Viburnum shot 16/23 from the free throw line (68%).

"We played very poorly. Our defense was unacceptable," said head coach Mick Byrd.

The varsity girls are now 11-5 overall (4-1 in the GVC).
