# Jr. High boys break six school records

## Take 2nd place at Linn

The Vienna Junior High boys opened their track season Friday, March 23 at Linn, finishing second place behind Linn.

Final team scores were (1) Linn 158.5, (2) Vienna 147, (3) Fatima 81, (4) Blair Oaks 63.5, (5) South Callaway 44.5, (6) St. Elizabeth 38.5, (7) Tuscumbia 15, and (8) Chamois 10.

"I couldn't be prouder of these boys," said head coach Chuck Woody. "They have worked very hard this spring and definitely showed it Friday."

The Eagles broke six school records in their performances on Friday.

Tim Weakly finished 1st in the 100M Hurdles with a new school record of 16.34. He came back and won the 100M Dash with a time of 12.10 and Brett Alexander was second with a 12.30. Tim then went to set another record in the 400M Dash, breaking his own record with a time of 56.63.

Brett Alexander won the Long Jump with a distance of 16'3 and took first place in the 200M Dash with a record time of 25.47.

Damon Farrow won the 800M Run, breaking his own record with a time of 2:20.13. Curt Rowden won the 1600M Run with a time of 5:36.09.

The 4x100M Relay team of Wayne Fick, Tim Barnhart, Curt Byrd and Edward Wieberg finished third with a time of 55.39. The same group took first in the 4x200M Relay with a time of 1:56.84.

Barnhart took seventh in the Pole Vault with a new record of 6'6.

"He and Curt Byrd are the first Pole Vaulters at Vienna in several years," said Woody.

Colby Martin took second in the Shot Put with a distance of 39' 5 1/2 and second in the Triple Jump with a distance of 31' 8 1/2. Farrow was third in the Shot Put with a heave of 39'5.

Tyler Helton took third in the Discus with a heave of 105'11 and fourth in the 400M Dash with a time of 65.52. Rusty Moles took eighth in the Hurdles with a time of 21.25 while Jason Davis took sixth in the 800M Run with a time of 2:46.54.

The 4x400M Relay Team of Tyler Helton, Edward Wieberg, Curt Rowden and Damon Farrow broke the school record on their way to a first place finish with a time of 4:18.38.

"I am extremely proud of the boys performance Friday," said Woody. "Linn has a few more boys to run and score points than we do, but we sure did put up a lot of points for the size of team we have. The boys put on a great performance and hopefully they will stay hungry and try to better themselves."
