The Vienna High School junior varsity girls basketball team dropped one and won one last week.

On Thursday, January 3, the girls hosted St. Elizabeth and dropped a close game to the Hornets, 41-45. The Eagles trailed 20-26 at the half.

Jamie Sandbothe led all scorers with 11 points, 3 rebounds, 2 steals, 1 assist and 1 block; Casey Steinman, 8 points, 1 rebound, 1 steal, 1 assist; Kacie Gibson, 7 points, 3 rebounds, 1 steal; Tasha Sandbothe, 6 points, 1 rebound, 2 steals, 1 assist, 1 block; Whitney Schoene, 2 points, 1 rebound; Kelly Vogt, 1 point; Amanda Henderson, 1

point, 1 rebound; Misty Willoughby, 1 point, 2 rebounds, 2 steals; Holly Schwartze, 1 rebound, 1 steal; Kacey Huffman, 1 rebound, 1 assist; Emily Miller, 1 rebound, 1 assist; and Kelley Wieberg, 1 rebound, 3 steals.

Vienna shot 13/29 from the field (44%) and 12/22 from the free throw line (55%).

"This was one of our better played games of the year so far," said head coach Mick Byrd. "We had our chances to win. A couple of more free throws and a couple of fewer turnovers and we could have pulled it out."

On Friday, January 4, the girls hosted Cuba and defeated the Wildcats 48-41 after trailing 15-16 at the half.

steals; Casey Steinman, 2 points, 1 rebound, 1 steal; Kacey Huffman, 2 rebounds; and Emily Miller, 1 steal.

Vienna shot 18/60 from the field (30%) and 9/28 from the free throw line (32%).

"Our JV played an excellent defensive game," said Byrd. "Lots of enthusiasm and effort. We really disrupted their offense with our press. Both Kelly Vogt and Kelley Wieberg did a real nice job defensively. We had four players with 8 or more points. That's good

balance."
