

# JV girls win fifth straight

The Vienna High School junior varsity girls basketball team won their fifth straight game after beating the Cuba Wildcats and Bourbon Warhawks in games last week.

On Monday, February 11 the girls used a 31-17 second half to defeat the Cuba Wildcats 51-32.

Casey Steinman led all scorers with 15 points (one 3-pointer), 2/3 FT, 8 rebounds, 5 steals, 2 assists. Kacey Huffman added 10 points and pulled down 8 rebounds.

Ohters stats include Emily Miller, 5 points (one 3-pointer), 2 steals; Kelly Vogt, 5 points, 5/10 FT, 1 rebound, 3 steals, 1 assist, 1 blocked shot; Kelley Wieberg, 4 points, 6 rebounds, 5 steals, 1 assist; Jamie Sandbothe, 4

points, 0/4 FT, 9 rebounds, 3 steals; Tasha Sandbothe, 4 points, 2/2 FT, 4 rebounds, 1 steal, 1 assist; Kacie Gibson, 2 points, 0/3 FT, 5 rebounds, 3 steals; Lacey Baxter, 2 points, 1 rebound, 1 steal; Holly Schwartz, 0/2 FT, 4 rebounds, 2 steals, 2 assists; and Whitney Schoene, 4 rebounds, 2 stelas.

Vienna shot 20/71 from the field (28%) and 9/24 from the free thorw line (38%).

"We started off very sluggishly, but played a much better second quarter. We had a size advantage and piled up 50 rebounds to Cuba's 30. That will win a lot of games," said Head Coach Mick Byrd.

On Thursday, February 14 the girls traveled to Bourbon.

Vienna took an early 17-0 lead after the first quarter and a 33-4 lead at the half on their way to a 38-14 win. The game was shortened to three quarters because of Bourbon's lack of players.

Kacib Gibson led the team with 8 points (one 3-pointer), 1/4 FT, 1 rebound, 3 steals, 1 assist; Kelly Vogt, 6 points (one 3-pointer), 3/4 FT, 2 rebounds, 1 steal; Jamie Sandbothe, 6 points, 4/7 FT, 5 rebounds, 1 assist; Tasha Sandbothe, 6 points, 3 rebounds, 3 steals, 1 assist; Kacey Huffman, 4 points, 2 rebounds, 2 steals, 1 assist; Kelley Wieberg, 3 points, 1/2

FT, 2 rebounds, 1 steal; Lacey Baxter, 2 points; Casey Steinman, 2 points, 1 rebound, 1 steal, 2 assists; Emily Miller, 1 point, 1/2 FT, 1 steal, 1 assist; Holly Schwartz, 1 rebound, 1 assist; and Whitney Schoene, 1 rebound, 2 steals.

Vienna shot 13/24 from the field (54%) and 10/19 from the free throw line (53%).

"We blew open a 33-4 halftime lead and the game was basically over. We shot the ball really well and passed it well. It was our JV girls' fifth win in a row," said Byrd.

The junior varsity girls are now 11-6 overall (7-2 in GVC).
