

Varsity girls fall to Iberia & Viburnum

The Vienna High School varsity girls basketball team dropped two games last week as they fell to Iberia and Viburnum.

On Monday, February 18, the girls lost their Parent's Night

contest to the Iberia Rangers 55-73. The score at the half was 24-43, Iberia.

Kelly Hollis was hot from 3-point land as she nailed five 3-pointers on her way to scoring 18 points. She also pulled down 4 rebounds and had 1 steal and 1 assist.

Amanda Stratman had a good night as she scored 14 points, 2/4 FT, and pulled down 9 rebounds. She added 4 steals, 2 assists and 1 blocked shot.

Vienna shot 20/72 from the field (28%) and 6/19 from the free throw line (32%).

"Iberia is a senior dominated team. They have a lot of fire power, particularly offensively. We had a good game offensively ourselves, putting up 55 points against a very good team. Kelly Hollis shot the ball great from the perimeter," said Head Coach Mick Byrd.

On Thursday, February 21 the girls dropped a 38-51 decision to Viburnum. Vienna trailed 17-24 at the half.

Kelly Hollis, Amanda Henderson and Whitney Wieberg led the team with 7 points each. Hollis went 4/6 from the free throw line and had 2 rebounds and 1 steal. Henderson went 5/8 from the free throw line and had 1 rebound and 3 steals. Wieberg went 1/2 from the free throw line and had 2 assists.
